New American Standard Bible (NASB)

⁶ Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all [a]comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Luke 11:1

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

11 It happened that while [a]Jesus was praying in a certain place, after He had finished, one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John also taught his disciples."

Romans 8:26

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

²⁶ In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for *us* with groanings too deep for words;

¹⁵ The eyes of the LORD are toward the righteous
And His ears are *open* to their cry.

² I pour out my complaint before Him;

² [a]Do not be hasty [b]in word or [c]impulsive in thought to bring up a matter in the presence of God. For God is in heaven and you are on the earth; therefore let your words be few.

⁶ Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time, ⁷ casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you.

⁵ So Peter was kept in the prison, but prayer for him was being made fervently by the church to God.

⁷ And behold, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared and a light shone in the cell; and he struck Peter's side and woke him up, saying, "Get up quickly." And his chains fell off his hands.

¹⁸ ^[a]With all prayer and petition ^[b]pray at all times in the Spirit, and with this in view, ^[c]be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints,

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

⁵ Then He said to them, "^[a]Suppose one of you has a friend, and goes to him at midnight and says to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; ⁶ for a friend of mine has come to me from a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; ⁷ and from inside he answers and says, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been shut and my children ^[b]and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you *anything*.' ⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him *anything* because he is his friend, yet because of his ^[c]persistence he will get up and give him as much as he needs.

⁹“So I say to you, **[a]**ask, and it will be given to you; **[a]**seek, and you will find; **[a]**knock, and it will be opened to you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks, receives; and he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, it will be opened.

John 15:7

⁷ If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.

1 John 5:14

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

¹⁴ This is the confidence which we have **[a]**before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

Matthew 6:9-13

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

⁹“Pray, then, in this way:

‘Our Father who is in heaven,
Hallowed be Your name.

¹⁰ ‘Your kingdom come.

Your will be done,

On earth as it is in heaven.

¹¹ ‘Give us this day **[a]**our daily bread.

¹² ‘And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

¹³ ‘And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from **[b]**evil. **[c]**[For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.]

¹⁸ If I **[a]**regard wickedness in my heart,
The Lord **[b]**will not **[c]**hear;

³ You ask and do not receive, because you ask **[a]**with wrong motives, so that you may spend *it* **[b]**on your pleasures.

Isaiah 59:1-2

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

59 Behold, the LORD’S hand is not so short
That it cannot save;
Nor is His ear so dull
That it cannot hear.

² But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God,
And your sins have hidden *His* **[a]**face from you so that He does not hear.

Luke 6:12

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

¹² It was ^[a]at this time that He went off to the mountain to pray, and He spent the whole night in prayer to God.

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

⁴⁴ And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground.

Colossians 4:2

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

² Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with *an attitude of* thanksgiving;

Psalms 13:1-2

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

13 How long, O LORD? Will You forget me forever?
How long will You hide Your face from me?
² How long shall I take counsel in my soul,
Having sorrow in my heart all the day?
How long will my enemy be exalted over me?

Psalms 22:2

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

² O my God, I cry by day, but You do not answer;
And by night, but ^[a]I have no rest.

2 Corinthians 12:7-9

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

⁷ Because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to ^[a]torment me—to keep me from exalting myself! ⁸ Concerning this I implored the Lord three times that it might leave me. ⁹ And He has said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.” Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast ^[b]about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me.

Mark 14:35-36

³⁵ And He went a little beyond *them*, and fell to the ground and *began* to pray that if it were possible, the hour might ^[a]pass Him by. ³⁶ And He was saying, “Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will.”
